I. BACKGROUND BRGY. YUBO PROFILE

Barangay Yubo is an inert and remote barangay of La Carlota City in Negros Occidental. It is about 18 kilometers from the City and is located on the Southeast of La Carlota City proper bounded by Barangay Haguimit on the West; Barangay Ara-al on the Northern part; bordering Honoban River on the south; and Barangay Sag-ang, La Castellana area with Canlaon Volcano on the East. It is about 3 kilometers away from the national highway.

According to some information gathered from some authorities, during the Spanish occupation a group of thieves, known as "TULISAN" used the forest as their hiding place. At that time, the Sitio was inhabited by few people whose small cogon huts were scattered among their stack and burned farms commonly known as "KAINGIN" which they cultivated for their livelihood. Not long after the Tulisans settled in the forest, a wise good man was robbed and found dead. A few days later, an edible leaf-like plant known as "TAYUBO" grew on the mound of his grave, thus the place was called.

Another version gathered from the different authorities, this place before was unpopulated covered with thick trees and grasses.

Later, people come to clear parts of the place and stared to plant crops. People from other places also cleared some parts and starts planting different crops for living. Years by, population of the place increases. After the settlement of the people, some erosion occurred, another soil formation which is bigger than the river emerges. And from the big fallen and withered trees an ear-like plant or white-colored mushroom grows which they call "TAYUBO" to which the place as called and later was changed to YUBO in 1910. As of this day the ear-like plant can rarely be found in the forest.

Sitio Yubo was originally part of Brgy. Haguimit, La Carlota City. It was only in 1951 that it became a barangay and Mr. Marcelino Demerin was appointed as the first *Teniente del Barrio* who served from 1951-1955. During his term in Yubo Primary School grew and became Elementary School and the school building was changed from temporary nipa school house to a Hilado Type School Building.

Mr. Alfredo Arsenio succeeded Mr. Marcelino Demerin as Barangay Captain from 1955-1959. His achievement was the construction of the barangay road from Crossing Danao to Brgy. Yubo.

Finally, an election took place and Mr. Ruperto Demerin was elected as Brgy. Captain who served from 1969-1973. His efforts bore fruits and resulted to the construction of the Marcos type buildings, Health Center, Multi-purpose Center and water supply for the barangay. He was later succeeded by Alfredo Arsenio who assumed from office 1973-1977 and it was during his term that *Barrio Yubo was change to Barangay Yubo*.

In 1985-1989, Mr. Paterno Demerin took the reign of Barangay Yubo. He extended the Health Center and took care of the maintenance of the barangay road. It was in the late 80's that insurgency and atrocity became a problem in the barangay. This was the main reason that the upper part of barangay Yubo was declared by the National Government under "No Man's Land". The school was used as an

evacuation center for the people living in the upper part of the barangay.

From 1989-1993, Mr. Reynaldo S. Arsenio became Barangay Captain. During his term another school building was built, the barangay site was established and the Barangay Hall was also constructed with the help of our city officials under the leadership of our beloved Mayor, JUANCHO AGUIRRE.

Later in 1993, Mr. Guillermo Garcia Jr. assumed the office of barangay Captain. His achievement were the electrification of the barangay site, the construction of Multi-Purpose Cooperative Center, development of barangay road, the employment of the barangay plaza, the guard house for the barangay tanod and water supply, moreover, in his tenure thru Mrs. Teresita M. Panes, the school head of Yubo Elementary School, during that time realized through her vision to put up an extension high school, from her ideas La Granja NHS - Yubo Extension was materialized and cater the graduates of Yubo Elementary School to secondary education. Mr. Rembert A. Calimutan, successor of Mr. Guillermo Garcia Jr. from 2004-2013 continued the plan, programs and projects of the previous administration.

Mr. Dennis C. Valencia Sr. is the elected Barangay Captain of Barangay Yubo last October, 2013 Barangay election. Under his leadership the Barangay Hall was extended, Day Care Center and Health Center renovated and modernization of Barangay Hall and Health Center facilities were materialized. He spearheaded the Electrification Project of Sitio Bais and Parkingan in his first term of office. However, despite of his track record in the implementation of these project, the sovereign voice of the people of Barangay Yubo still demanding him in the fulfilment of concreting the barangay road. The road is very rocky and bumpy. It is not fully concreted yet. A two-storey building for the high school was also constructed and repair of the school building in the elementary also took place.

Mr. Benoni T. Demerin is the elected Punong Barangay of Barangay Yubo during the May 14, 2018 Barangay Election.

Since Barangay Yubo is one of the outlying villages of La Carlota City. It lies along the slopes of the Mt. Kanlaon volcano and is considered by PHILVOLCS as one of the four hazard prone communities around the volcano. It has a total land area of 1,090 hectares. The main threat to the village and its residents come from the active volcano. Barangay residents, especially in the sitios of Bais and Labinsawan, live within the Mt. Kanlaon danger zone located just at eight kilometers from the crater. Frequent tremors and seismic activity were felt, especially after the 6.9 magnitude earthquake in February 2012. It was reported that a 50 meters long crack has been noted near the crater, while other cracks and a landslide have been recorded within Mt. Kanlaon Natural Park. These factors pose primary hazard to rural villages along its slopes and adjacent areas.

Lying up in the highlands, Barangay Yubo is also vulnerable to other natural hazards like tornado, thunderstorm, landslides, floods and strong winds and rains during typhoon season. At the height of Typhoon Pablo in late 2012, a tornado completely toppled 43 residential houses including a Day Care Center and partially damaged another 36 houses. Banana plants that provide monthly cash income to village residents were likewise levelled by the typhoon.

For now, Barangay Yubo is gradually adopting the trend which modern world introduces. Some families have access to modern technology and parents are sending their children to higher education. So that in the years to come they will improve their way of life and economic status.

(Based on Historical Events in relation to man-made and natural hazard occurred)

Date	Event
October 1969	Mt. Kanlaon Volcano Erupted. Yubo residents evacuated to the town center at the La Carlota Gym.
1970's	'Slash and Burn' farming further extended into the upland Areas as more settlers arrived as a result the upland areas were denuded.
1980's	The Sitios was devastated by a super typhoon "Nitang" that fell forest trees, uprooted farmer's houses, damaged rice areas and flooded the rivers.
1987 _{UK}	At the height of the military Operation plan against the NPA, farmers were forced by the military to evacuate to the Barangay center and school for couple of the Month.
1990's	Another super typhoon, "Rufing" ravaged the upland farms.
1994	The Banana Bunchy top virus struck at the Mt. Kanlaon slopes and decimated the Banana plants. Banana harvests declined rapidly and farmer's income also fell drastically. This resulted to more denudation of forested to illegal logging and charcoal making.
1996	Mt. Kanlaon emits ashes and stream that killed 2 German Mountaineers
February 2012	A 6.9 magnitude earthquakes occurs in Western Visayas, resulted to Mt. Kanlaon temporary closure to mountaineers until latter part of 2012. A magnitude 5 earthquake felt in Yubo that causes landslide in Sitio Bais and Labinsawan that partially damage some nipa House.
December 2012	At the height of Typhoon Pablo, a tornado completely toppled 43 residential houses including a Day Care in Sitio Bais and partially damage another 36 houses from sitios.

A. ACCESSIBILITY

Yubo Extension High School is situated in Brgy. Yubo, La Carlota City. The school is one of the farthest schools in the Division of La Carlota City and is located near the five-kilometer danger zone radius of Mt. Kanlaon. It can be reached an hour travel through public utility vehicle and 30-45 minutes travel by private vehicle

B. OBJECTIVES

This 2019 Contingency Plan covers La Granja NHS - Yubo Extension, Division of La Carlota City, Region VI - Western Visayas. It focuses on volcanic eruption.

This 2019 contingency plan of Yubo Extension High School aims to:

- A. Protect children's right to safety and survival;
- B. Protect children's rights to educational continuity;
- C. Provide the community of the knowledge on what to do when confronted with such calamity;
- D. Determine the focal person in the school and community that they can go to;
 - E. Identify the evacuation center/site in the community;
 - F. Strengthen disaster resilience.

II. HAZARDS

La Granja NHS - Yubo Extension is located near the five-kilometer radius danger zone of Mt. Kanla-on. With its location, the school is vulnerable to natural calamities such as volcanic eruption, earthquake and landslide. Volcanic activity has been observed and recorded recently. This unpredictable activity poses a threat to the villagers and especially to the school children and education personnel. Hence, a contingency plan was designed to save lives and lessen the extent of damage to property. The welfare of the pupils is the paramount concern of the school; thus, it is imperative to design measures for the safety of the pupils and their families.


